Who We Are

The United Way of Langlade County is a non-profit corporation comprised of unpaid volunteers from the local community who raise and distribute funds each year. Local groups or non-profit organizations called affiliates provide services to Langlade County with those funds.

How Fund Distribution is Determined by the United Way of Langlade County

The United Way of Langlade County Board meets with local groups each year. Representatives explain to the Board what the non-profit organization does and how United Way funds will benefit individuals and families in Langlade County. After reviewing all of the requests, the Board determines how much can be allocated to each group. An organization may receive some or all of the requested amount. The United Way of Langlade County meets the affiliate requests to the best of their financial ability.

Antigo Community Food Pantry

The Antigo Community Food Pantry is a group of compassionate volunteers providing food and resources that sustain health and human dignity. The food pantry strives to collaborate, advocate and increase public awareness to achieve food security for everyone in our community.

Antigo Special Olympics

A.V.A.I.L., Inc.

Advocates for Victims of Abuse in Langlade County provides direct services to victims of domestic and sexual abuse, including emotional support, emergency shelter, emergency transportation, advocacy, peer counseling, support groups, Wisconsin Judicare, Crime Victim Compensation, and community education.

Boys & Girls Club of Langlade County

A non-profit organization located in Antigo offers a safe, positive place for kids. Supervised programs, special events, and activities are geared to inspire and enable all young people, especially those from disadvantaged circumstances, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens.



Boy and Girl Scouts

Through the scouting program, Langlade County Scouts participate in educational, camping and citizenship training, and community service programs.



Childcaring, Inc.

Childcaring is a non-profit resource and referral agency which provides services to parents, child care providers, employers and communities in Langlade and surrounding counties.

Children's Service Society of WI

The Children's Service Society of WI offers the opportunity for mothers and fathers to learn to be the best possible parents they can be. The non-profit center provides a nurturing environment where parents can connect with resources, access programs and enjoy family activities with their children at no cost.

Diaper Bank

The Langlade County Area Diaper Bank was established in 2015 to be a resource for families in need. The Diaper Bank is a collaboration of four community agencies: AVAIL, Antigo Head Start, Langlade County Health Department and Langlade County Social Services. Nearly 1 in 5 children living in Langlade County live in poverty and we continue to see families struggle to afford the basic necessities such as diapers.

Salvation Army

The Salvation Army provides emergency financial assistance for those in need throughout Langlade County. With their network of volunteers, they provide assistance with food, housing, utilities, clothing, and transportation to those who are currently experiencing a difficult time due to unexpected emergencies and other unfortunate life events.

Senior Center

Serves the adult population of Langlade County and surrounding areas, ages 50 and older and provides for the needs of this population, including daily socialization, interaction with peers, educational programs and community interaction opportunities.

SS Mary & Hyacinth Charity Fund

Established on July 1, 1996, initially as the Antigo Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, SS. Mary & Hyacinth Charity Fund has provided for the material and spiritual needs of the poor in the Antigo area for the past 26 plus years. The mission of the Charity Fund is to seek out and assist those who lack adequate food, shelter, clothing, health care, and other necessities of dignified human existence.

WeekEnd BackPack Program

This affiliate provides nutritious foods to children in kindergarten through high school on Fridays throughout the school year. The backpacks provide foods from all food groups that are easy to prepare. In addition, nutrition education is provided through examples of foods sent home as well as newsletters to parents.
